Maths

Your child's Maths topics are Converting Units followed by Ratio, Algebra and Decimals. Your child will:

- convert between metric and imperial measures
- explore ratios and understand the meaning of :
- explore formulae, solving one or two-step problems using algebra
- understand the relationship between whole numbers (integers) and decimals; multiplying and dividing decimals

The Arts and Technology (Music, Art, DT, Computing)

Your child's Music topic is based around the theme of 'A New Year's Carol' by Benjamin Brittens. Your child will listen to and appraise many of Brittens' works.

Your child's Computing topic is Programming – Variables in Games. Your child will learn how to write algorithms, create webpages and use spreadsheets.

Humanities (History, Geography, RE, PSHE)

Your child's Geography topic is Coastal Processes and Landforms. In Geography your child will explore many different geographical processes, looking at a range of habitats and areas such as the Jurassic Coast.

Your child's History topic is Roman Britain. In History your child will explore the invasion of Britain and delve into how the Romans impacted and changed Britain over time.
