


My child is happy at Banks Road.


My child feels safe at Banks Road.




Banks Road makes sure its pupils are well behaved.




My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively. 97 responses




Banks Road makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.





Does your child have special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND)? 97 responses




My child has SEND, and the school gives them the support they need to succeed. $\ensuremath{\text{18}}\xspace$ responses




Banks Road has high expectations for my child.


My child does well at Banks Road.




Banks Road lets me know how my child is doing.



There is a good range of subjects available to my child at Banks Road. 97 responses




My child can take part in clubs and activities at Banks Road. 97 responses

- More updates on the children's learning, class dojo has lacked alot this year compared to his previous year group. Find it hard to speak with teacher after school because it's rushed, and I find you can't really discuss anything discreetly as the teacher can be quite loud. My child wakes up every morning and complains he feels sick. This is to avoid going to school. When trying to get him through the gates he has to be collected by the teaching assistant, so I don't know if my child is happy. When I question how he is the response I receive is "he's had a great day" My child is on the ASD pathway so knowing anything about his day is crucial for his diagnosis. I received his first PPP this term and again I find his focus and attention effects his learning. Why do I find this out from a PPP and not from his teacher.

- We are very happy with the school and will be sorry to move the kids to another school due to a house move. Keep up the good work. I only have a couple of niggles that I would like to mention: I would appreciate a few more healthy options or replacements during school lunches, e.g. fruit as an option for dessert, wholemeal bread only, brown pasta only. No crisps with the sandwich option (it is probably an impossibility but one can hope I am still not used to this being a thing as the UK is not in my home country). We have been told that chocolate is not an appropriate addition to a packed lunch which contained a wholemeal sandwich and apple. But then children bringing in rice crispy squares or packets of Doritos to school as snacks which are objectively not any better than chocolate are not called up on that. It is probably not possible to enforce this, but I would like to encourage a more consistent messaging. Another problem I have is when calling the office to notify them of illness-related absences, both children have been marked with unauthorised absences. I am certain that I called every day there were off sick and was not told on the phone that the reasons stated were not acceptable. I have been in contact with the office and have escalated this today with Mrs. Seaton.
- Staff really go that extra mile, to fully engage the children in learning. I believe they work with the
 individuals strengths and use these to effectively encourage participation. They also identify there
 weakness or if they are struggling with a particular aspect, they focus on things they can put in place to
 build confidence so they can gain a better understanding whilst feeling supported to overcome the
 issues.
